Sales Tax Holiday: August 10-12

This year's Sales Tax Holiday is August 10-12. As in previous years, the law exempts most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks priced under \$100 from sales and use taxes, which could save shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend. The dates for the sales tax holiday are set by the Legislature. Subject to certain criteria, all sales of qualifying items made during the holiday period qualify for the exemption, including items sold online, by telephone or mail. The newest edition to the Dallas Zoo, a baby gorilla born in June, made its public debut on July 5. Zookeepers said a 22-year-old critically endangered Western Lowland Gorilla named Hope



delivered the baby. The newborn and its mother and father are allowed to roam in the Gorilla habitat, visible to the public for the first time. The baby and mother have been behind-the-scenes since the birth, bonding as a family. The baby's father is a Western Lowland Silverback named Subira. Zookeepers said that he was the first of the gorilla family to meet the newborn after delivery and gently put his lips on the baby's head. Plug in for a Greener Planet. Plug in to Something NEW.

DART's got a lot of new. This spring, the agency introduced new ways to pay, with the new version of the GoPass app. Now DART is giving you new ways to ride, with a new fleet of zero-emission electric buses.



Rolling in downtown Dallas, these seven new buses provide clean, quiet transportation on the D-Link route. That makes two zeroemission options in downtown, joining DART Rail as the other vehicle with that distinction. These buses recharge fast, with the propulsion battery going from 10 percent state of charge to 90 percent in just 10 minutes. Eight battery packs power the bus-six on the bottom and two on the top.

The new electric buses seat 28 people, which means fewer singleoccupancy vehicles on the roadway. These buses also use 30 percent fewer parts than a traditional bus and do not require oil changes or exhaust after-treatments.

Rolling out an electric bus may seem like a small thing, but it can have a big impact. Each electric bus reduces emissions by nearly 244,000 pounds of carbon dioxide per year. These new electric buses emit no tailpipe pollution. This is particularly critical in Dallas-Fort Worth, one of the largest and fastest-growing metropolitan areas in the United States. The electric fleet is one more way DART is helping to clear the air across North Texas.

Landmark Exhibit - Slavery at Jefferson's Monticello: Paradox of **Liberty** September 22-December 31

African American Museum (3536 Grand Ave, Dallas, TX 75210)



A groundbreaking and widely acclaimed exhibition with a powerful message, Slavery at Jefferson's Monticello: Paradox of Liberty is coming to the African American Museum next month. Dallas will be the first city to host the updated touring exhibition, which

brings to life the story of slavery at Monticello through more than 300 objects, works of art, documents and artifacts unearthed at the storied plantation. The exhibition features new items never seen outside of Monticello, including a special feature on Sally Hemings, one of the most famous African American women in American history. As an enslaved woman at the age of 16, Hemings negotiated with one of the most powerful men in the nation ensuring she would receive "extraordinary privileges" and achieve freedom for her children. Jefferson fathered at least six children with Hemings, four of whom survived to adulthood.

Slavery at Jefferson's Monticello: Paradox of Liberty is an exhibition that uses Monticello, the home and plantation of Thomas Jefferson, to explore the dilemma of slavery and the lives of the enslaved families and their descendants. The exhibition presents Monticello as a microcosm of the American story - a lens through which to understand the complicated dynamics of America's founding, and the ways in which the legacies of slavery continue to shape the nation.

Paradox of Liberty briefly examines Jefferson's views, actions and inaction on slavery, and then focuses on the enslaved individuals and families who lived and labored at Monticello. In addition to objects belonging to Jefferson, more than 300 archaeologically recovered artifacts elucidate the lives and work of six enslaved families, making for a visually rich, powerful presentation. Using material from the Getting Word Oral History Project, the exhibition follows the families through Emancipation into the present.

Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$5 for children 3-12, and free for children 2 and under. Also, admission will be free on Thursdays only for seniors 65 and older.
